What does CCA look like in 11th grade?

CCA begins in the Spring of your Junior Year and is held once a week during Humanities classes.

What is accomplished in CCA?

- Registering with Naviance (college readiness site)
- Prospective College List
- Attend college rep visits
- Draft of college essay
- Completion of PPAS brag sheet

Our goal is to have all 11th graders prepared to 'hit the ground running' at the start of senior year. They will also learn,

- The financial aid processes
- How to obtain college application fee waivers
- How to request teacher recommendation letters

So far we have...

- Covered the Key Components of College Applications
- Registered and explored Naviance
- Learned about financial aid and scholarships

Soon students will,

- Learn about different types of college applications
- Build their college lists
- Work on their college essays

What can 11th grade parents be doing this Spring to support their child's college process?

- Virtual and In Person College Tours/Fairs
- Attend College Night Series covering financial aid, scholarships, support programs, and IEP information
- Make sure your child is attending their classes, including CCA
- Help your child study for SAT (after school at PPAS and Atlas Prep)

SAT Prep

- What does a college being Test Optional mean?
 - If a college or university has a test-optional admissions policy, that means they allow all or some applicants to decide whether to submit SAT or ACT scores as part of their application. It doesn't mean that schools aren't interested in seeing all applicants' test scores—but if a student doesn't submit their scores, it won't be counted against them in the application review.

- Atlas Prep
 - Financial aid available
 - Hybrid SAT/ACT available

- PPAS after-school SAT Prep
 - Math SAT Prep for May SAT
 - PPAS is expanding SAT prep

What does CCA look like in 12th grade?

- In September, 12th graders will move through the college process in small advisory groups once a week during their Humanities class, with additional individual student and/or student/parent meetings scheduled as needed.
- These advisory groups will prioritize one to one support throughout fall and spring: applications, financial aid, & college decision making.

- Work on college supplements

August 1st

Common App opens

December and January

<u>Ist</u> (most private schools application deadlines) Time to submit applications!

- Complete CCA designated tasks. (Draft of college list, draft of college essay, virtual college visits, virtual college fairs, and virtual rep visits.)
- Take the SAT or ACT

Spring of Junior Year

October and November

• If students are applying regular decision, they should be working on applications now.

October 1st

Fafsa Opens

November 1st
