- Jeff Cavalli seconded
- Vote passes with unanimous vote

#### **Musical Theater Delegate Vote**

Uncontested - no vote needed; Ketsia Poiteuren and Deborah Weitz will be the new delegates

#### **Treasurer's Report**

- Budget will be finalized by June 30
- GoFundMe still open \$671 was applied to misc.
- Gala netted \$17,000
- Alumni Coalition deferred part of its \$6K donation
- \$44,794 profit with \$38,000 to be withdrawn for expenses (\$7K "profit")
- Remaining food budget will roll over
- Expenses still to come senior breakfast, senior prom
- Question about Middle School 50/50 raffle \$490 (in the first line as an unspecified item)
- Next year prom deposit already paid
- Continuing to build buffer back up after Covid (\$26K rolled over last year)
- Question about bringing new expense to PTA (eg. audio for performances information to be presented to new Executive Board)
- Wait until January to review any budget spend (see how things are going without outgoing senior parent monetary support)
- Process for bringing new events and fundraisers in the new year go through principal and get approval, then bring to Executive Board

- Raising money for MainStage needs to involve Jeff Statile; considered a separate project (not PTA)
- Question about \$10K equipment video camera PTA paid B&H directly; Principal Dyer provided more context (see below)
- Question about where the recorded performances are archived or made available to parents - every production has different rights and not all students have signed releases (an effort to encourage families to sign waivers in the fall was suggested - also at orientation)
- Flower sales better than expected
- Mention of Bylaws review this summer
- Effort to reach new audiences via delegates was mentioned for next year

## **Principal Dyer's Report**

- 125 new high school students admitted to PPAS for 2025-26
- 33 new students in middle school next year
- Regents results incredible!
- Thanks to outgoing Executive Board and welcome to incoming board members
- Discussion about film camera and importance of professional equipment to be used beyond Film Department
- New website company could potentially create a platform to house videos (instead of posting them on YouTube)
- Keep in mind PPAS is a smaller school with reduced resources
- Suggestion for release forms to be signed at beginning of the year for students cast in all productions
- Mention of importance of video to show performances to the public to enhance PPAS' reputation beyond those who attend PPAS
- Question about \$632,000 grant from the state (via Tony Simone). It has been processed
  by the school Principal Dyer is negotiating with the state when it would be added to
  budget; it's a slower process still need to determine lump sum or over time; there is
  another \$100,000 additional in funding Principal Dyer requested it over time for staff
  and additional teachers; reduced classroom funding was applied for; new donation
  coming in TBD for now
- Principal Dyer's overall goal is to be more sustainable in the future
- Mention of anonymous donations that are made throughout the year as well
